#### THE DEEP END: Prophets and Home Countries

You cannot be a prophet in your home country' is a well-known phrase. You don't have to go too far to see examples of this gospel around you. Anyone who returns to their home town with new knowledge and wisdom can sometimes be put in their place. This is what occurs in Jesus' home town of Nazareth in today's gospel. Even though the crowd are impressed by the local carpenter's son, astounded even, and note that he has great wisdom, still he could do no deed of power there. It is definitely a reality check experience. Have you ever had this experience in your own life? A time you were really excited about a new-found knowledge or inspired by a great event or speaker; yet when you returned to tell friends or family members they made fun of you or greeted you with cynicism? Or you can imagine yourself in the crowd today, listening to the local carpenter's son, so full great teachings you can't quite believe it. In the end Jesus left and went around the villages teaching. Simply put, there are times when you have to move on and bear fruit elsewhere.

'Lord how often you have sent Jesus to us in the form of someone we knew well, but they were just too ordinary for us. All we could see was the carpenter, the son of our neighbour ... So the great miracle you had in store for us could not be worked. Lord have mercy.'

# An appeal to help a school in a poor area of Zambia, Africa Sr. Angela Brennan who taught in Presentation Secondary School Bandon for many years and now works in Zambia, is

appealing for help to extend a large primary and Secondary school in Kaoma, located in the north-east corner of the Western Province of Zambia. Situated on the edge of the Kalahari Desert, this is the least developed province of Zambia. In 1998 the school was begun by Sr. Mary Moloney from Holy Cross, Tipperary to cater for the many orphans and vulnerable children who were unable to provide uniforms and small fees required in the Government schools. The first classes began in the Parish Hall and gradually with the aid of various donations and land from the local Council she built up the school as far as Junior Secondary (from Junior Infants to Junior Cert level). Then, in 2014 the school was asked to take Senior Secondary students and today it is catering for about 1,700 students. While the Ministry of Education extended the school to full Secondary it did not provide any classrooms. Therefore, this necessitated 3 sessions of learning for classes from Grades 1 to 4 in the same classroom, with at least 42 students in each class. The students were reduced by 1 hour

the small fees that are charged for running costs. The Government pays the teachers and randomly gives small grants towards maintenance.

In 2016 the Presentation Sisters took over the school as a Grant Aided school. Sr. Angela is at present applying to different funding agencies to construct classrooms, specialist rooms, toilets, and administration blocks. These blocks have almost reached roof level thanks to the Presentation Sisters in America and Ireland as well as Electric Aid Ireland. Hopefully

learning time in the day. Most of the students who attend this school are either orphans or vulnerable and are unable to pay

Misean Cara (Irish Aid) will fund 3 classrooms and 3 Specialist rooms. Most funding agencies only give 75% of the cost. The balance has to be provided elsewhere. Another 6 classrooms are needed.
